 - Conduct a small project
 - > Purchase equipment
- 2. Promote and support surveys of rare diseases
- 3. Promote and support surveys of clinical innovations
- 4. Promote and support educational projects

The BSPED's Clinical Committee is at the forefront of standard-raising and clinical guidance in British paediatric endocrinology and diabetes. As Clinical Standards Officer on the Committee, you would undertake the <u>responsibilities of the BSPED Clinical</u>

Committee identified in the Terms of Reference and specifically:



- Respond to any clinical standards queries received by the BSPED
- Consider and prioritise requests for new clinical standards from the BSPED membership
- Oversee the development of new clinical standards in paediatric endocrinology and diabetes
- Facilitate the internal and external peer review of developed standards according to the BSPED's policy
- Ensure the review of the BSPED clinical standards every 3-5 years (just completed).

The current Clinical Standards Officer, Dr Pooja Sachdev, will complete her term of office in November 2024 and the successful candidate will be invited to join the Clinical Committee meeting in September, with a view to handing over in November for a 3-year term of office.

BSPED and ACDC Position statement on Medtrum pump and sensor

Paediatric diabetes centres will have received the list of approved providers of HCL systems under the NHSE procurement framework. Medtrum is included on the list but centres may not be aware that at present, Medtrum has also not provided any published evidence of safety and efficacy on the use of the system in children, despite multiple requests for them to do so. The Diabetes Technology Network (DTN) have also issued a statement raising their concerns around the inclusion of the Medtrum HCL in the list of approved systems. In line with the DTN, the BSPED and ACDC (Association of Children's Diabetes Clinicians) do not recommend that the Medtrum HCL system should be used for children and young people with diabetes in the UK until published evidence of its safety and efficacy is provided.

Annual General Meeting 2024



New rhIGF-1 guidance documents

The BSPED Growth Disorders Special Interest group (SIG) is delighted to share two new related documents recently approved by the BSPED clinical committee:

 BSPED Recommendations for Recombinant IGF-I Therapy in Children with Severe Primary IGF-I Deficiency (SPIGFD)

The aim of this recommendation document is to guide UK paediatric endocrinologists considering the use of rhIGF-I for severe primary IGF-I deficiency (SPIGFD).

Updated: UK Paediatric Endocrine Standards

The <u>UK standards for Paediatric Endocrinology</u>, which were initially published in 2019, have recently been reviewed and updated by the BSPED. They are endorsed by the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health. The standards apply to all children and young people aged 0-18 years with an endocrine condition. The aims of the standards are to reduce variability in care and to ensure that equitable services providing high quality, safe and effective care are available to all children and families across the UK. The standards are intended for healthcare professionals and for service commissioners to plan, deliver and quality assure paediatric endocrine services.

BSPED and RCPCH statement on puberty blockers for central precocious puberty

The Cass Review on gender identity services for children and young people (CYP) published on 10th April 2024 has recommended that puberty blockers should only be used as part of a clinical trial in CYP with gender identity concerns. The British Society of Paediatric Endocrinology and Diabetes and the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health wish to make it clear that this is completely different from using puberty blockers in children who have an earlier puberty than normal. This is known as precocious puberty and defined as signs of puberty in girls before the age of eight and before the age of nine in boys. Puberty blockers in children with early puberty have been used for many decades. There is good evidence on their long term safety and efficacy, with no evidence of adverse impact on fertility, bone strength or psychological wellbeing in children who are treated for precocious puberty and thus we continue to recommend and support their use in children with precocious puberty under the supervision of a paediatric endocrinologist.

Long-acting growth hormone (LAGH) is now available in the UK and is recommended by NICE (2023) as an option for the treatment of growth hormone deficiency for children and young people aged three years and over.

A clinical practice guideline for the use of LAGH was identified as an unmet need by BSPED and Growth Disorders SIG members. This new position statement aims to summarise the latest data and provide recommendations on dosage and surveillance for clinicians prescribing LAGH. Currently only one LAGH preparation is licenced, but other preparations are likely to become available. We will update this guidance when new LAGH preparations are accessible to patients in the UK.

 'Shared care guidelines for paediatric use of daily and long-acting recombinant human growth hormone'.

This document replaces 'Shared Care Guidelines: Paediatric use of Recombinant human Growth Hormone (r-hGH, Somatropin)' produced by a BSPED Clinical Committee working group in 2017. The latest document incorporates updated shared care guidance for somatropin and its current licenced indications. The latest iteration also includes long-acting growth hormone preparations (LAGH).

NICE draft guideline consultation Adrenal insufficiency: identification and management

The BSPED has submitted a response to the <u>draft NICE guideline</u> and it is expected the guideline will be published at the end of August 2024.
